The Text Exercises are a process of finding by doing. They are engaged with the yet-to-be-determined, and as such are all schematics.

The Draft Objects are aids in the writing of the Text Exercises, where drafting = (writing + construction of language + marks) + materiality.

Contributions are what have been asked for from others in order to extend the current limits of the writer's hand.

Materials are tools for or objects of ongoing research while writing.

The thing that is trying to be found, through research, the yet-to-be-determined project, has four aspects:


- 1) its form

- 4) its relationship to what has already come before it


