

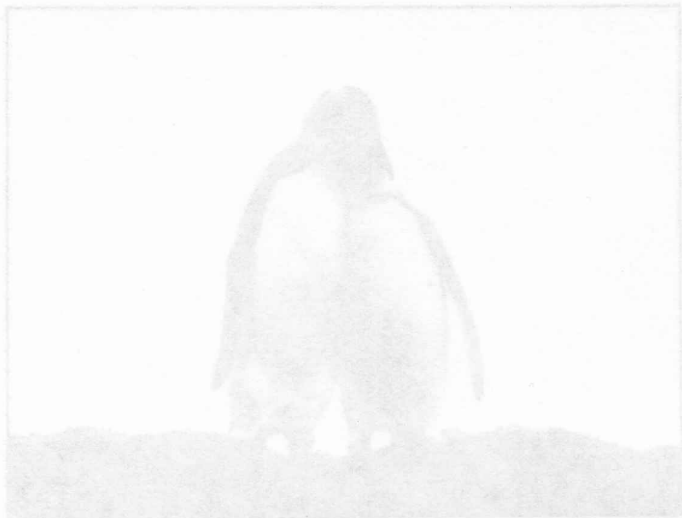
Bruno J. Zehnder was born in Bad Ragaz, Switzerland in 1945. He has come to photography only in the last phase of his life before picking up a camera, he spent ten years experimenting and traveling—to over one hundred countries—in search of adventure and the place in the scheme of things. Now Zehnder has become an internationally known photographer who has been on assignment in seven continents, and his work published in many major magazines worldwide. His photographs have been shown in twelve one-man shows in New York, Washington, DC and Tokyo. He has received countless awards for excellence. Bruno Zehnder's particular love is the Antarctic, and he has made seven trips to that frozen and isolated part of the world, often alone, photographing and exploring.
