No Local Stops, 1984

This costume was used in Heyward's expanded 90-minute performance *No Local Stops*, which comprised of 17 interconnected 'songs'. The costume, which is battery operated, was used for a sequence called *Heart Runs Fast*.

Heyward's works often inhabited multiple simultaneous formats. *This Is My Blue Period* exists as both a multi-media performance and a single channel video. This is the original script from Heyward's performance at Artists Space, NYC.

Video, 42:18 minutes

360 is recognized as the first ever 'video album'. The piece, a prototype for video disc, then an emergent format, is segmented into ten sections equivalent to songs on a record. To complement Heyward's visuals and lyrics, musical arrangements were composed by Heyward and her collaborators Jody Harris (Raybeats, The Contortions) and Don Christensen (Raybeats, Bush Tetras). The work was never transferred to video disc.
