

# Via Além - techniques and vision

Pivô Research is Pivô's residency programme, which annually hosts approximately 25 national and international artists along the year to facilitate artistic exchange and stimulate creative processes. Throughout 2016, during her yearlong residency at Pivô, Danish artist Marie Kølbæk Iversen has been investigating the dynamics and impacts of fright and trauma across human cultures and lives.

The artist concludes her residency with a symposium, taking place within a two-day research exhibition curated by Kølbæk Iversen for the occasion. Under the title *Via Além – techniques and visions,* she has invited artists, writers and therapists from Brazil and abroad to contribute with artworks and presentations, in order to investigate processes of 'becoming-other,' and the transformative potentials of fright.

Kølbæk Iversen's exploration of fright draws on her on-going projects such as "Mirror Therapy," which was shown at this year's Gwangju Biennial in South Korea, and her work cycle "lo/l." Through these projects she examines the potentials of fright and trauma – feelings, which she however interprets as power tools, not as paralyzing agents: if one can learn to cope with being frightened in the encounter with the unknown, transformative potentials might open up. As such, her own process of moving to a faraway country has served as a real-life vehicle for artistic and theoretical investigations of encountering the unknown.

Fright is one of the innate affects that have been preserved throughout evolution in a variety of species. It can thus be called an 'interspecies commons', as it is shared by humans and non-humans alike. Despite being a survival instinct, fear and fright can also be induced and manipulated to function as a political and ideological means of oppression, according to French philosopher Paul Virilio. Through her research, Kølbæk Iversen is therefore searching for ways to (re)claim the faculties of fear and fright, in order to conceive of new entry points into the future, through and beyond oppressive orders.

Thus, in October 2016 she travelled to Acre to establish connections with Amazonian indigenous tribes, who regard fright as a necessary step on the path of individual and collective transformation. According to the artist by way of etnopsychiatrists Tobie Nathan and Cathrine Grandsard, Amazonian Amerindians culture fright through the ayawaska ceremony to learn how to cope with being frightened – not mastering fright – for the sake of becoming-other. Thus synthesizing European, South American and Amerindian cosmovisions, Kølbæk Iversen rehearses a possible narrative of how to perceive of worlds

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based on unknown logical principles; how to conceive of significant change in troubled and oppressive times.

Ovartaci, posthumously participating in the symposium, is emblematic for the mobilizations and intentions of *Via Além – techniques and visions*. Ovartaci is the feminine alter-ego of Louis Marcussen, who migrated to Argentina in the 1920s to try his luck as a hired hand. In 1929, he returned to his native Denmark as a changed man after having stayed with an indigenous tribe on the border between Argentina and Brazil. The gates of his perception had been opened: Marcussen had become aligned with the spirit world, and was receiving. Back in Denmark he was soon admitted to a mental institution and diagnosed with schizophrenia. During his long confinement lasting until his death in 1985, Marcussen however produced an impressive oeuvre documenting the parallel worlds he had gained access to.

Ovartaci is a symbol of the possibility of breaking the binary logics between ill and well, conscious and subconscious, home and away; of remaining in the shadowlands between such poles to receive of the unknown and the becoming as it makes itself known – sometimes frighteningly so.

Eleven participants will be contributing to the symposium and the research exhibition. What unites them is an interest in exploring the mind's elasticity through practical and conceptual proposals to question the commonplace of status quo.

The symposium runs from 1.30 pm to 5 pm on Saturday December 10<sup>th</sup> with contributions by Júlia Roubouças, Rivane Neuenschwander, Júnia Rjeille Cordeiro, Guattari Reading Circle, Jørgen Vestergaard, and Marie Kølbæk Iversen.

It takes place within the setting of a research exhibition curated by Marie Kølbæk Iversen for the occasion encompassing works by Balthazar Berling, Glenn Christian, Lea Porsager, Rolf Nowotny, Ovartaci, and Marie Kølbæk Iversen. The research exhibition opens on Dec. 9<sup>th</sup>, 1 pm – 7 pm.

Immediately after the symposium, at 5 pm, Marie Kølbæk Iversen hosts the São Paulo launch of *If Earth were a Body, Borders would be Wounds* – a book about "Mirror Therapy," on show in the research exhibition. The launch takes place at La Central on Pivô's ground floor.
