A hula from Big Island, a battle between Hi'iaka, Pele's youngest sister and Panaewa, a wicked god.

4. **Ka Poli Laua'e** (choreography by Sonny Ching)

A hula from Kaua'i, Hi'iaka healing Lohi'au bringing him back to life.

5. Na Uwe O Na Manu (choreography by Darrell Lupenui)

A hula about native Hawaiian Birds.

6. **Mai Italia kō lei nani** (choreography by Luana Haraguchi)

A hula about the crown jewels that were shipped from Italy to Hawaii for queen Kapiolani's coronation.

7. **Aia I Nu'uanu** (choreography by Olana A'i)

A hula from Oahu, a Lei chant for Queen Kapiolani at the coronation of her husband, King Kalakaua.

8. **Hamakua** (choreography by Uncle George Na'ope)

A hula/mele ma'i from Big Island, a procreation dance.
