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Matthew Harrison (b. 1989, Detroit) lives and works in Detroit. He earned a BFA from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago in 2012. Upcoming shows include Detroit Affinities (solo exhibition curated by Jens Hoffman) MOCAD, Detroit; The Politics of Portraiture, Group exhibition, Jessica Silverman Gallery, San Francisco; and Take Me (I'm Yours), curated by Hans Ulrich Obrist, Jens Hoffmann and Kelly Taxter, Jewish Museum, New York, NY.

Hannah Jones works with painting, drawing, collage, writing, video and dance. Originally from Ohio, she completed a bachelors degree for studio art at Oberlin College in 2013 and subsequently relocated to Detroit. Locally, she coproduced the former experimental performance series, Underword and recently exhibited work at Trinosophes. This past winter she was a resident artist at Round About LX in Lisbon, Portugal.

Maddie Kuzak (b. 1993) is pursuing a BFA at Wayne State University. Selected exhibitions include Into You, ATM Gallery, Austin, TX; Daydream, Institut für alles Mögliche, Berlin; 2nd Base, 1521 W. Forest, Detroit; holiday, Sagamore Motor Lodge, Royal Oak, MI; and Beautiful Trash, People Closet Gallery, Keego Harbor, MI.

Matthew Luther lives and works in Detroit. He completed his BFA at College for Creative Studies in 2014. Recent shows include Daydream, Neiderlassung Berlin, organized by Ashley Cook and Aric Miller; Our town, Knight St. Artspace, Melbourne, with Matthew Landry and Matthew Linde; Reproduction, What Pipeline, Detroit; and Ethira, Arcadia Missa, London, organized by Amalia Ulman.

Crystal Palmer (b. 1984, Winnepeg, Manitoba; lives and works in Detroit) completed her BFA Summa Cum Laude in ceramics from Wayne State University in 2013. Recent exhibitions include "Good Piece of Food," collaboration with Isaac Pool, Greylight Projects, Brussels; "Late November," Cornerstore, Chicago; "Material for Living," Trinosophes, Detroit; and "Salad and I Know It," performance, Brooklyn Arts Exchange, Brooklyn. Upcoming shows include curating "House Shoes" at Cornerstore, Chicago.

Leif Ritchey (b. 1975, Ann Arbor, Michigan; lives and works in Ann Arbor and NYC) attended Community High School in Ann Arbor, MI. In addition to painting, he is formerly a clothing designer with his wife Tooya and a musician in the group Shades. Recent exhibitions include Luce Gallery, Turin, Italy; Gumbo Shoes, The Journal Gallery, Brooklyn, NY; Sun Tea, Itd los angeles, Los Angeles, CA; and I Know You Got Soul, ARNDT, Singapore. Upcoming shows include Face to Face, curated by Eugenio Viola, Palazzo Fruscione, Salerno, IT.

Bailey Scieszka lives and works in Detroit. She holds a BFA from the Cooper Union in New York City. In 2010 she was awarded the Benjamin Menschel Foundation Grant to travel to Las Vegas. Her videos, drawings, and puppet shows center around her alter ego named Old Put the Clown. She has had solo exhibitions with Trinosophes (Detroit) and Plymouth Rock (Zürich). Her puppet play "All The Brown Butterflies" has been performed at The Detroit Puppet Art Theatre, Cave (Detroit) and Essex Flowers (New York). The sequel, "The Soft Side of Hardcore", was performed with Feuer Mesler for NADA New York and A La Luna Bar (Zürich). She has been included in group shows with Bed Stuy Love Affair (Brooklyn), The N'Namdi Center (Detroit), The Smile Face Museum (New York) and First Continent (Baltimore).

Nolan Simon was born in 1980 in Detroit, Michigan where he now lives and works. He received his BFA from College for Creative Studies in 2005. Recent solo exhibitions include Lars Friedrich, Berlin; Green Gallery, Milwaukee; 47 Canal, New York; and Reisebürogalerie, Cologne. His work has been included in exhibitions at White Columns, Sculpture Center, and Cleopatra's in New York; Cave and What Pipeline in Detroit; Night Club in Chicago; Sies and Höke in Düsseldorf. Upcoming projects include curating (with Jake Palmert) Landscapes at Marlborough Chelsea.

Dylan Spaysky (b. Waterford, MI) lives and works in Hamtramck, MI. Selected exhibitions include: Susanne Hilberry (Detroit, MI), NGBK (Berlin), Cleopatra's (Brooklyn, NY), Museum of Contemporary Art Cleveland (Cleveland, OH), and Clifton Benevento (New York, NY).

Born in Beijing, **Jen Wang** is an oil painter and sculptor currently living and working in Southeast Michigan. Her recent work includes a year of on-site observation and installation at a heavily-littered intersection in suburban Long Island, drawing 5-foot tall copies of the Unabomber's mugshot 30 times in a Detroit studio, floristry, and currently, making a series of works forcing mythical and biblical narratives onto defenseless stuffed animals. She works from her studio on Klinger in Hamtramck.



















Crystal Palmer Untitled (meditation stool), 2015 Stoneware 16 X 8.25 in.




