Janitoria is in the rearguard. Manifesting maintenance, repurposing, consumption and waste. The brush and trash can are the main icons transposed into characters in this tableaux. Objects and buildings become flashy facades, patterns and acts unfolding in their own moments of public functional hysteria. Anthropomorphized utility, as the consumed becomes the consumer.

His work has been included in group exhibitions at the Orange County Museum of Art, David Zwirner Gallery, NY, Hiromi Yoshii Gallery, Tokyo, and Museu de Arte Moderna da Bahia, Brazil. He currently has a solo show at Agency Contemporary Art, Los Angeles and forthcoming projects include a screening of his recent digital video collaboration *The New World of Lina Bo Bardi* at Storefront, New York and a solo show with Mark Flores at Commonwealth and Council, Los Angeles.

Marte Eknæs (b. 1978 Norway) studied at the Glasgow School of Art, earned her BFA from California Institute of Arts and an MFA from Central Saint Martins College of Art & Design. She currently lives and works in Berlin. Her recent solo exhibitions include Trondheim Kunstmuseum, Kunstnerforbundet in Oslo and Between Bridges, London. She has been included in numerous group exhibitions throughout the United States and Europe, has been awarded residencies in Berlin and Detroit and was nominated for the Statoil Art Award in 2011.
