Maria Athanasopoulou is Assistant Professor in Modern Greek Literature and Literary Theory at the Department of Drama, Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. She has worked extensively on the poetry of C.P. Cavafy, on the theory of literary genres, on the relation of literature to the visual arts, as well as on the transnational element of modern Greek literature. She is the author of three books of literary criticism with particular reference to the poetry of the early  $20^{th}$  century in Greece.

Helena Papadopoulos is an art historian and the founding director of Radio Athènes, the non-profit institute dedicated to the advancement of contemporary visual culture.

She has organized over 60 exhibitions of contemporary art in her capacity as an independent curator and later as founder of Nice and Fit, Berlin, Helena Papadopoulos, Athens and as co-founder of Melas Papadopoulos, Athens. Her writing has appeared in numerous exhibition catalogues.
