Rescreening


MICKEY is pleased to present Rescreening, an exhibition of new works by Kevin Weil produced between 2019-2021.

Three new videos observe and re-present, through sequences of predominantly handheld-camera shots, banal architectural bureaucracies that order and obscure labor and state. Projected, televised, and captioned, Weil's usages of b-roll footage, soundtrack, photographs, and collected objects express the aesthetics of outmoded administrative structures, latent with exploitation and potential for violence. Weil's visual and auditory assemblages cut institutions to their skeletal structures through a series of subtle architectural deviations. The subjects of the works, counter-sites of public access – city centre, museum, library, garden and homeland security training facility – become placeholders as the exhibition contests and inverts the logic of the gallery. Employing layers of mediation as its title implies, Rescreening offers a surround of reverberating systems of display.
