While these documents (which begin with a white title card) are not artworks themselves, they do represent artworks and convey an experience of that work. In a similar way, the art on view here, which is not mine, represents my occupation as an artist and conveys an experience of my work.

Making work in this way is something that I've been pursuing for a little over a year. To a greater extent than in my previous shows, this exhibition is a structured viewing of the artworks. The proposition is that you are in an exhibition by Jason Hirata."
