Henry Matisse drew a shrub with black paint using a brush three years before he died, he called the painting *Shrub*. I saw an illustration of this drawing in a book. On the opposite page was one of his silhouettes. The monochrome color areas of the silhouette were in strong contrast to the black lines of the drawing. Both works beautiful, one lived from the surfaces and colors, the other from the delicacy and poetry of the stroke.

For some time I had been asking myself how to give more space to the quality of the drawing in painting. In my working process, the drawings sketched on the canvas disappeared as soon as the physical color in the form of surfaces and volumes brought the subject to light. For two years I tried in various ways to bring surfaces, colors and sketches into a balance. In my latest works I have found a way to combine the weighty and material, earthy of painting with the expression of the momentary, the direct and at the same time fragile of sketching.
