Rosha Yaghmai Night Walker 11/13/16 – 12/12/16

On sleepless nights, I walk; but mostly I sit on a bench near my house. Tired, my mind wanders, my eyes lose focus, and that which fills my vision blurs, or rather: merges. Edges lose their focus, light and dark their distinction. In this way disoriented, my mind fails to make the usual connections, and I can see anew again. Against the residual glow of the city night, the looming wall of an apartment building recedes only to contrast with what I know are windows, but appear something else entirely: floating geometric instances of color. Streetlights shatter into fractals, and I can go there, or somewhere else, and be something else. It occurs to me to be afraid, but like everything else in the shadows I too am something to fear.

Cleopatra's is proud to present Night Walker, a solo exhibition by Los Angeles based artist, Rosha Yaghmai. The exhibition is comprised of 4 new works: a pair of silicone screens, alongside cast and assemblage sculptures. The works included in the exhibition result from her continued interest in the psychedelic and out of body experience- using foreignness, transformation and estrangement as a way to open up the possibility of a connection to other temporalities. This will be Yaghmai's first show in New York. All works are from 2016.
