

Hana Miletić: Pieces

8.7.-2.10.2022.

Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art, Krešimirova 26c, Rijeka, Croatia



The solo exhibition of Hana Miletić, one of the internationally most acclaimed young contemporary Croatian artists, is her first major solo institutional exhibition in Croatia. After notable international presentations at both large group and solo exhibitions, such as Kunsthalle Bergen (2021) and WIELS Bruxelles (2018), MMSU will for the first time in Croatia present her new textile artworks.



Pieces, a solo exhibition by Hana Miletić presents an overview of the artist's recent textile installations and brings together brand new commission of works created especially for the exhibition in Rijeka. The exhibition unfolds in a dialogue with the exhibition space and the surrounding context, taking into account its past and present, its original purpose and the transformations which followed.

In her work, Hana Miletić uses textiles and the process of weaving as her main material, incorporating other media and materials as well – photographs, objects, installations and sound – to point to the contexts of individual and social processes of production. Using the methods of "repairing" and recycling as her basic means, the artist creates these soft and light abstract compositions, as places which record and inscribe different meanings, states, feelings, relationships and perspectives – such as fragility or precariousness, as well as attitudes towards time, which show her interest in the history of labor and the transition of industrial modes of production, the position of women in the textile industry, and the consequences of deindustrialization.

With this exhibition, Hana Miletić continues her search for manufacturers and manufacturing sites of Croatia's fast declining textile industry. Large scale textile artworks as the carpet *RAD* (2019), created in collaboration with the Zabok-based Regeneracija factory or the installation *Materials* (*Arena*, *Pula*) (2020) serve as a dedication to the places of textile production and its various technologies. During her stay in Rijeka as an artist-inresidence (Kamov residency progam), Hana researched Rijeka's former industries, such as tobacco factory once situated in the museum building, the paper mill Hartera and its rag room, as well as the existing local textile industry. *Materials* (2022) are based based on urban transformations, permanent or temporary repairs on streets, street furniture, windows of buildings or cars, that Miletić encountered in the city of Rijeka, more specifically in the neighbourhoods of former factories. In collaboration with Rijka textile company Rio Biz d.o.o. and the composer Lieven Dousselaere, Miletić created a new spatial and context-specific installation composed of tailoring scraps.

The exhibition is organized in collaboration with Kunsthalle Mainz, opening in October.

Hana Miletić was born in Zagreb (1982), she lives and works in Brussels. Departing from a background in documentary photography, and inspired by the long tradition of handwork in her family, Hana Miletić has developed an artistic language based primarily on the creation of handwoven textile works. She uses the weaving process to reflect on the social and cultural realities in which she lives and works. In her weaving practice, Miletić reproduces public gestures of maintenance and repair, capturing infrastructures and objects in flux, or in various states of transition.

Weaving, which requires practice, time, care and attention, allows her to formulate new relationships between work, thought and the emotional sphere, as well as to counteract certain economic and social conditions at work, such as acceleration, standardisation and transparency.
