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Analog Diary presents a group show of tumultuous, psychological, frequently figurative, and sometimes grotesque artworks which seem to scream "This monster lives!"


The exhibition title, *Some Kind of Monster Roster*, is a mash-up of Metallica's 2004 song and homonymous documentary film "Some Kind of Monster," and a loosely connected group of Chicago artists active in the 1950s designated as the Monster Roster by artist/critic Franz Schulze in 1959. Inspired by the raw expressiveness of Jean Dubuffet and Outsider art, Monster Roster artists like Leon Golub often explored the existential crises of World War II and human suffering in their work.


This exhibition posits a conversation between contemporary artists and their historic predecessors. The monsters are both literal and figurative. They are painted, drawn, sculpted, filmed. At times they are dark and brooding; elsewhere they are playful and humorous. Monstrosity can be a state of mind, a talisman, a violent atrocity. Like Mary Shelley's Frankenstein, this show is comprised of many disparate parts which, when assembled, become a creature which is "fearless and therefore powerful."


















