Aimee Goguen is a moving-image artist based in Los Angeles. She has participated in group shows including Mountain of the Collapse, JOAN Gallery, Los Angeles (2022), Accidentally on Purpose, Panel LA, Los Angeles (2017); Protuberances at LAXART, Los Angeles (2016); THINGS: a queer legacy of graphic art and play at Participant Inc. New York and ONE Archives, Los Angeles (2016); and screenings at venues including REDCAT, Los Angeles (2020); Anthology Film Archives, New York (2015); and White Columns, New York (2014). Her animation appears in the films Queercore: How to Punk a Revolution and William S. Burroughs: A Man Within, and her video work has been included in such anthologies as The Oxford Companion to Queer Cinema, and reviewed by William J. Simmons and Dodie Bellamy. Her writing has been published by Golden Spike Press, Curse of Cherifa, and Playboy Magazine. Goguen has generated analytical lists for artists including Math Bass, Seth Bogart, Hayden Dunham, Tom of Finland, and Alfred Hitchcock. Born in Lethbridge, raised in Calgary, Cindy Lee is now a Durham North Carolina based songwriter, performer and recording artist known worldwide as one of the last great lounge singers and as a living guitar legend. A transient drag queen and dangerous drifter hellbent on corrupting the youth of America.

They have sold out of every album they've ever made, each record a bold landmark in the history of pop music. After 4 releases with the Superior Viaduct label (Suicide, DEVO, Alice Coltrane, Ennio Morricone) they now self release thru "Realistik Studios".

Beautiful and compelling Pop tracks and L-I-T-E torch ballads in the great tradition of Roy Orbison, Ros Sereysothea, Gloria Ann Taylor and Patsy Cline. A blurring of fiction and reality are a theme, apparent in the contrast between grandiose pop ambitions and amateur recording techniques.

Darya Diamond

judgment proof, 11:48, 2020

Darya Diamond is a Mexican-American artist working in print, sculpture, audio and film. She explores literal and symbolic figurations of the body as a primordial workplace. Her practice is ritually and theoretically rooted in methods of reproduction — regenerating and renegotiating the promise of transactional intimacy, care, and invisible labour. The nexus of Diamond's research is deeply grounded relational ecosystems and the contradictory subjectivities involved in sustaining and maintaining bodies and minds. How is the body a site of mutual aide, power, pleasure, and labour? Casts and personal surveillance footage provide rich material landscapes from which to reappropriate, re- contextualise and exhibit an ethics of care.

Barry Doupé

Distracted Blueberry, computer animation, 4:33:00, 2019

Barry Doupé (b. 1982 Victoria, BC) is a Vancouver based artist primarily working with computer animation. His films use imagery and language derived from the subconscious; developed through writing exercises and automatic drawing. He often creates settings within which a characters' self-expression or action is challenged and thwarted, resulting in comic, violent and poetic spectacles.

His films have been screened throughout Canada and Internationally including the Ann Arbor Film Festival (Ann Arbor, Michigan), International Film Festival Rotterdam (Rotterdam, the Netherlands), Anthology Film Archives (NY, New York), Lyon Contemporary Art Museum (Lyon, France), Pleasure Dome (Toronto, ON), MOCCA (Toronto, ON), Whitechapel Gallery (London, UK), Centre Pompidou (Paris, France), the Vancouver Art Gallery (Vancouver, BC), and the Tate Modern (London, UK).

Maebe A. Girl

McRib, 6:15, 2019

Maebe A. Girl (she/they) is the first drag queen ever elected to public office in the United States. She is currently serving her 2nd term on the Silver Lake Neighborhood Council in Los Angeles where she serves as Treasurer and At-Large Representative.

Maebe is also a co-founder and co-chair of the LGBTQ+ Alliance of Neighborhood Councils -the first city-backed LGBTQ+ group in the City of Los Angeles' history.

Maebe is running for the US House of Representatives in CA-30 for a second time, challenging longtime incumbent Adam Schiff. In 2020, Maebe lost the primary election by only 1,114 votes, or less than 1% of all votes cast in the election. She won the primary for the 2022 election and became the first trans non-binary person to advance to a general election for the US House of Representatives. She hopes to be the first trans person elected to US Congress, and is running on a platform that includes Medicare for All, the Green New Deal, LGBTQ+ rights, racial justice, free college, getting corporate money out of politics, and more.

D. Hoffos

D. Hoffos was born in Montréal and grew up in a string of cities in Ontario, Alberta, and Australia. They began making experimental films at the age of 10. After many failed attempts to go to film school, Hoffos finally entered the Department of Art at the University of Lethbridge in 1990 where they received their Bachelor of Fine Arts in 1994. Since 1992 Hoffos has maintained an active practice – with over 50 group shows, hundreds of screenings, dozens of school and community collaborations, a few works for the stage and over 40 solo exhibitions, including a survey at the National Gallery of Canada. In 2010 their touring 6-year installation series, *Scenes from the House Dream*, was showcased at the Art Gallery of Nova Scotia, Halifax, and the Museum of Contemporary Canadian Art, Toronto. In 2014 Hoffos completed permanent public sculpture projects in Grande Prairie and Lethbridge. They have received awards including the Images Grand Prize, 2007, and a Sobey Art Award (2nd place), 2002. After a lengthy illness, Hoffos returned to the studio in 2022.

Bruce LaBruce

super 8 ½, 1:44:49, 1994

Bruce LaBruce is a filmmaker, photographer, writer, and artist based in Toronto but working internationally. Along with a number of short films, he has written and directed fourteen feature films, including "Gerontophilia," which won the Grand Prix at the Festival du Nouveau Cinema in Montreal in 2013. As a photographer he has had numerous gallery shows around the world, including a photo exhibit called "Obscenity" at La Fresh Gallery in Madrid which caused a national ruckus in Spain. His feature film "L.A. Zombie" premiered in competition at the Locarno film festival in 2010 and was subsequently banned in Australia. His latest movie, "Saint-Narcisse," was named one of the top ten films of 2021 by John Waters in Artforum. His new porn feature, "The Affairs of Lidia," from Erika Lust Films, was released in 2022.

LaBruce has contributed to a variety of international magazines, newspapers and websites as both a writer and photographer, including index magazine, for which he also acted as a contributing editor, Vice, The National Post, The Guardian UK, Honcho, Purple Fashion, Numero, Dazed and Confused, Tank, BlackBook, Bon, Fantastic Man, Man About Town, and many others. His photo book "Death Book" was published by Baron Books in 2020.

LaBruce has had a number of notable film retrospectives, including one at the TIFF/Bell Lighthouse under the auspices of the Toronto International Film Festival in 2014, and one at MoMA in New York in 2015. His latest feature, "Saint-Narcisse," is currently on the festival circuit and will be released internationally in 2021. His new photography book, "Death Book," is now available from Baron Book. A new book of his photography called "Fixations" will be out early next year from Milos Mestas Editions.

Maggie Lee's work has taken shape in a wide array of forms including sculpture, installation, photography, zine-making, blogging and moving image. Her videos often oscillate between the personal and the pop-cultural, blending diaristic self-documentation with collaged found sound and image. Lee's work probes the emotional undercurrents and personal resonances of contemporary culture: memories of the artist's early years in suburban New Jersey, candid scenes from New York City nightlife, and totem-like odes to the assorted mass-produced ephemera that adorns daily life.

Lee garnered significant acclaim for her 2015 feature-length video Mommy, assembled in the process of the artist clearing out the contents of her childhood home in Westfield, New Jersey. Using a wide array of materials—film slides, home movies, voicemail messages, pixelated cell phone videos, and motion graphics that harken back to Web 1.0 aesthetics—the work provides a piercing glimpse into both the story of the artist's mother's emigration to the United States from Taiwan and Lee's own coming-of-age. Earlier works such as her *Video Salad* series (2009-2011) or *Fall NYC* (2014) often take

a similar approach, freely mixing quotidian moments, documentation from concerts and parties, appropriated imagery, and music with DJ-like dexterity.

Maggie Lee was born in 1987. She has had recent solo exhibitions at Jenny's, New York; Édouard Montassut, Paris; Lomex, New York; 356 Mission, Los Angeles; Real Fine Arts, New York; and LadyBug House, San Francisco. Her work has been featured in group exhibitions at Loong Mah, New York; Svetlana, New York; Shoot The Lobster, New York; Stadgalerie Bern, Bern Switzerland; White Columns and Art Production Fund, New York; Museum of Chinese in America (MOCA), New York; Musee d'Art Moderne de Paris, France; Kai Matsumiya, New York; Kunstalle Zürich, Switzerland; T293, Rome, Italy; the Whitney Museum of American Art, New York; Schloss, Oslo, Norway; Triple Canopy, New York; New Museum, New York; and Greene Naftali, New York. She lives and works in New York.
