About the Artists

Amy Granat was born in 1976 in St. Louis Missouri. She attended Bard College and has taught at NYU, Yale and University of Vermont. Her work has been exhibited widely in the US and Europe, including the 2008 Whitney Museum Biennial, PS1MoMA, The Sculpture Center, The Centre Pompidou, Palais de Tokyo, The New Museum, The Schoen, The Kunsthalle Zurich, basis Frankfurt, UCCA Beijing and more. Granat also co-founded Parapet Real Humans in 2015.

Shane Rossi was born in 1995 in Hartford, CT, and currently lives and works in New York. He had a solo exhibition, *A Romance*, at Parapet Real Humans, St. Louis, earlier this year. He also co-founded Francis Irv, an artist-run space in Lower Manhattan.

Sundblad / **Granat Films** is a collaborative film project between Amy Granat and Emily Sundblad. The films often depict the two women performing singular everyday actions, at times their appearances blur and the two women become indistinguishable. Granat and Sunblad's collaborative films have been screened at Kunsthalle Zurich, CCS Paris, Christain Nagel Cologne, Castillo/Corrales Paris, Green Gallery Milwaukee and the Sydney Biennial.
