

The Botanical Revolution

About the necessity of art and gardening.

The garden has appealed to the imagination for centuries. It is a place associated with harmonic idyll, a place where the cycle of life is expressed, a place for contemplation, tranquility from daily hectic and worries.

The botanical revolution tells the story of the garden as a fertile source of inspiration for artists. Over the centuries, artists, writers, poets and thinkers have described, depicted and designed the garden in different ways. Gerrit Komrij – from whose 1990 Huizinga lecture the title is taken – describes how the image of the garden

has long been closely intertwined with mentality developments and controversies between worlds of ideas.

The garden is also a rich source of inspiration in contemporary art. It is not a romantic desire that is central, but the call for a new awareness of our relationship with the earth. What contemporary reflections do artists offer on paradise, the allotment garden, climate change? Surprising classical and modern examples show the deep roots of the exhibition's themes.
