Solid Projections

Beth Collar, Coleman Collins, Nevine Mahmoud, Jeffrey Stuker Exhibition text by Mahan Moalemi

Larder is pleased to present the group exhibition, *Solid Projections* with Beth Collar (1984; Cambridge, UK), Coleman Collins (1986; Princeton, NJ), Nevine Mahmoud (1988; London, UK) and Jeffrey Stuker (1979; Fort Collins, CO), with an accompanying exhibition text by Harvard PhD candidate, Mahan Moalemi (1992; Tehran, IR).

Based between Berlin, New York and Los Angeles, the exhibiting artists examine the complexities of contemporary sculpture in relation to ancient, historical and cultural understandings of objects and their uses. The artists' dense and varied research points overlap in a number of ways including the relationship between nature and technology, craftsmanship and machine-based production, the use of the body and disembodiment, and the convergence of history, memory, archaeology and artifact.

Artist Bios

Beth Collar (b. 1984; Cambridge, UK) lives and works in Berlin, DE. Collar received her MA from the Royal College of Art, London in 2012. Previous exhibitions include *The Unforgiven* at Sundy, London, UK (2022); *AUTHORITY* at Aye Aye, Copenhagen, DK (2022); *Face Down In A Ditch* at Guts, Berlin, DE (2022); *Basher Dowsing* at von ammon co, Washington D.C. (2021); *End Quote* at stadium, Berlin, DE (2020); *Daddy Issues* at Dilston Grove commissioned by Matt's Gallery and Southwark Park Galleries (2019); *A Rock That Keeps Tigers Away* at Kunstverein München, Munich, DE (2017). Collar has been an affiliated artist with the veteran mental health and archeology charity, Waterloo Uncovered since 2015. Her solo show at the Westfälischer Kunstverein, Münster, DE will open in October 2023.

Coleman Collins (b. 1986; Princeton, NJ) lives and works in New York, NY and Los Angeles, CA. Collins received his MFA from UCLA, Los Angeles in 2018 and was a 2017 resident at the Skowhegan School of Painting and Sculpture. He participated in the Whitney Museum's Independent Study Program in 2019. Previous exhibitions and screenings have taken place at the Palestine Festival of Literature, Jerusalem, IS/Ramallah, PS (2023); Hesse Flatow, New York, NY (2022); Brief Histories, New York, NY (2022); Carré d'Art, Nîmes, FR (2022); Kunsthalle Wien, Vienna, AT (2021); Nothing Special, Los Angeles, CA (2020); Elizabeth Foundation for the Arts, New York, NY (2019); Artspace, New Haven, CT (2019), Itd los angeles, Los Angeles, CA (2018) and Human Resources, Los Angeles, CA (2018). Collins is a 2022 recipient of a Graham Foundation research grant. He has also received support from NYFA and Cafe Royal Cultural Foundation.

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Nevine Mahmoud (b. 1988; London, UK) lives and works in Los Angeles, CA. Mahmoud received her MFA from University of Southern California, Los Angeles in 2014 and her BA from Goldsmiths University, London in 2011. A two-person exhibition with Maren Karlson will open in September as part of Soft Opening's residency at Conceptual Fine Arts, Milan, IT. Jeffrey Stuker (b. 1979; Fort Collins, CO) lives and works in Los Angeles, CA. Stuker received his MFA from Yale University, New Haven in 2005.
