The group exhibition *Es ist nur eine Frage der Zeit* gathers works presenting perspectives regarding temporality, velocity, contemplation and control. The exhibition initiated as an inquiry surrounding perceptions of the term *metropolis*, yet, it rapidly became clear that *time* and its conditions would be the protagonists.

Several works on view regard the initial inquiry with depictions of painted cityscapes. Within these depictions the artists approach their subjects diversely, connoting the passing of time as contemplative, fleeting, and as a witness of grief and celebration. Subjects also appear figuratively. Their presence can indicate the state and effects of value, labor, care and consumption on the body over time. Some of the works are presented as tools and appendixes that confront the ephemeral and seek out strategies to measure and control its transitory essence.
