LANDSLIDE

Landslide is a new bookstore that stocks a constantly changing assortment of rare and new art books, artist editions, hard-tofind ephemera, and objects. Its primary presence is online, sourcing items both nationally and internationally, and occasionally the shop organises exhibitions to bring together friends and artists. Landslide is also dedicated to the publishing of books and editions, the first of which will be announced soon.

By way of friendly takeover, the new bookshop will take up residence at Sarah Cottier Gallery, in gallery 1 for the month of September, presenting an exhibition of artworks and major edition works by artists whose format predominately focuses on text and language. The bookshop's website is available to browse within the gallery space for those that wish to view the full collection on offer.

Allen Ruppersberg (b.1944, USA) is an American conceptual artist who resides in both Los Angeles and New York City. He belongs to the vanguard of early American conceptual artists who played a pivotal role in reshaping the very conception and creation of art. Ruppersberg's work encompasses a wide range of artistic expressions, including paintings, prints, photographs, sculptures, installations, and literary works in the form of books. For this exhibition, Landslide presents the artist's first exhibit in Australia with *"The Singing Posters (Part 1)"*. This work is a heartfelt tribute to the renowned poet Allen Ginsberg and his iconic masterpiece, *"Howl,"* composed between 1955 and 1956. Upon learning that his students at UCLA were unfamiliar with this significant literary gem, Ruppersberg, a dedicated educator, conceived *"The Singing Posters"* to serve as an innovative means to acquaint a new generation with the profound impact and enduring relevance of Ginsberg's influential work.

Raymond Pettibon (b.1957, USA) is an American artist who resides in New York City. He gained recognition in the early 1980s within the punk rock scene of southern California, his initial prominence was due to creating posters and album artwork for the band **Black Flag**. Over time, **Pettibon** has garnered widespread acclaim for his utilization of a wide array of American imagery. These encopass themes drawn from literature, art history, philosophy, religion, politics, sports, and sexuality. For this exhibition, presented for the first time in Australia are 25 of **Pettibon's** early artist zines. These pieces were initially published under his brother's record label, SST Publications, folded and center-stapled in 22 x 14cm sheets and issued in very small editions, usually of 500 where some 400 from the edition were destroyed by the artist himself. Working in Los Angeles, **Pettibon** produced more than 100 of these editions from the late 1970s through the mid-1990s.

The LSD Portfolio has been produced by London-based curator and gallerist **Rob Tufnell**. For the project, **Tufnell** invited twenty artists to create new works on blotter paper, more commonly associated with the distribution of Lysergic Acid Diethylamide or LSD. Artists include **Art & Language, Thomas Bayrle, Henning Bohl, Steven Claydon, Jeremy Deller, Jim Drain, Liam Gillick, Rodney Graham, Carsten Höller, Mark Leckey, Chris Martin, Aleksandra Mir, Matt Mullican, Laura Owens, David Shrigley, Philip Taaffe, Tal R, Mungo Thompson, Pae White and Richard Wright.**

Also included in the exhibition are works by **Ava Seymour** (b.1967, NZ), **Mythic Bootlegs** (anonymous), **Jackson Slattery** (b.1983 AUS), and a selection of books and objects from the **Landslide** website.
