Foxy Production proudly presents Hany Armanious' second New York solo exhibition Birth of Venus. Armanious' new works are cast from resin and resemble everyday objects that one may find in a garage, workshop or studio, including old tables, odd found objects, and even stereotypical artworks. He has also made a series of flat-works, his "Sneeze Paintings", by blasting air at wet resin. The exhibition captures the process of manufacture, of ideas and objects in formulation, using the workspace as the primal scene; yet this interest in productivity or the productive moment is subverted by the detailed perfection of the artist's simulations, as if he were setting permanently, and thus giving finality to, and perhaps even the death of, the creative urge.

In Armanious' provocative work, perverse actions take place upon unexpected materials, resulting in enigmatic objects, scenes and associations. Like a wry alchemist, he transforms the process of casting into a witty and symbolic practice. His detours and digressions through the systems he constructs, paradoxically foster both confusion and engagement. Sydney-based Armanious produces installations and sculptural forms, as well as paintings and drawings. He consistently surprises with his deft working and reworking of objects, materials, and references in order to remodel the everyday in uncannily lyrical ways.

Armanious has been selected to represent Australia at the Venice Biennale in 2011.
