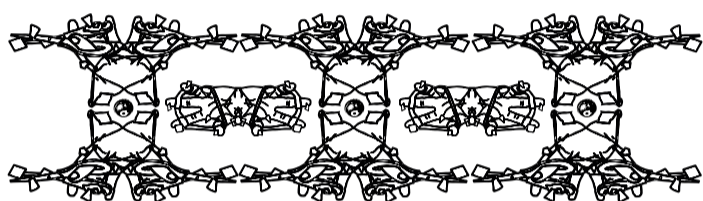

(in order of first author appearance):
