Chris Andrews is pleased to present Public Life (Drawings), a group exhibition of drawings, objects, and related ephemera.

Featuring works by Miguel Bendaña, Connor Bokovay, Justin Chance, Sojourner Truth Parsons, and Connie Wilson, the exhibition looks at the practice of drawing as a way of casting the world into material; a broker between life, idea, and object. The included artists approach the medium with differing degrees of convention – pencil crayon and graphite on paper, acrylic, wood assemblages, embellishments, silhouettes, machine knits draped over a drawn substrate – contrasting approaches to a familiar mode of representation. Engaging traditionally or only in feeling, here resides a slow feed of gesture, silhouette, embellishment, therapy, culinary art, public service announcements.

Justin Chance (b. 1993, New York, US) is an artist and writer based in New York. Chance received a Bachelor of Fine Arts and a BA in Visual & Critical Studies from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago in 2015. Chance's recent solo and two-person exhibitions include: Tara Downs, New York, US (2023); CFA, Milan, IT, presented by Downs & Ross (2022); Apparatus Projects, Chicago, US (2022); Tuesday, Richmond, US (2021); Smart Objects, Los Angeles, US (2021); Gem en Regalia, New York, US (2021); and Smart Objects, Los Angeles, US (2018). Sojourner Truth Parsons (b. 1984, Vancouver, Canada) lives and works in Brooklyn, NY. She holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts from Nova Scotia College of Art and Design, Halifax, Nova Scotia. Solo exhibitions include Esther Schipper, Berlin (2023), Foxy Production, New York (2022), Various Small Fires, Seoul (2020), and Oakville Galleries, Oakville (2017).

Connie Wilson (b. 1993, Belfast, Northern Ireland) received her BFA from NSCAD University in 2016 and an MFA from the University of Guelph in 2021. Wilson's work has been shown at Canadian galleries including Franz Kaka, Toronto (2022); Christie Contemporary, Toronto (2022); The Plumb, Toronto (2021); Boarding House Gallery, Guelph (2020); Calaboose, Montreal (2018); Musique, Halifax (2016); Anna Leonowens Gallery, Halifax (2015). In 2015 she served as an artist in residence at Andrea Zittel's A-Z West in Joshua Tree, California. Wilson is currently based in Toronto, Canada where she has a forthcoming exhibition with Riley Duncan at Pumice Raft.
