Foxy Production is pleased to present Waterwood, Gabriel Hartley's latest solo exhibition at the gallery. Hartley is known for his abstracted paintings that evoke figures and cityscapes. In his new series of acrylic and ink paintings on wood, he grinds into the grain of his surfaces to produce intense but subtlycolored images that are at once molecular and celestial. They suggest vistas of landforms and weather systems, as well as inner spaces, of the body or mind. The works play with the duality of representational painting: while it may simulate the world, it can also be appreciated as a confluence of forms, colors, and textures. The exhibition taps into the visceral pleasures of the opposing drives of human perception: to both sustain illusion and to deconstruct it.

Gabriel Hartley (London, UK, 1981) lives and works in London. He holds a BA in Fine Art from Chelsea College of Art and Design, London, and a Post Graduate Diploma in Fine Art from the Royal Academy Schools, London.
