The exhibition *Brudaholen* took its name from the cabin Brudaholen, in which it was also installed. Brudaholen is a small mountain cabin in Skihelledalen, a valley in the southernmost part of the region Sunnmøre in Norway.

The original cabin was built around 1948. After decades as a partial home and shepherds cabin it was demolished and rebuilt in 2006 by Jostein O. Alme, several of his friends and his uncle Ola Røyhus, who also took part in the construction of the first cabin 60 years before.

Brudaholen is an open cabin for anyone walking in the mountain in the need for a place to rest.

The exhibition *Brudaholen* was installed, documented and taken down Sunday July 11 2021.
