



From a deeply existential perspective, Mančuška explored the connection between language and reality as it relates to the individual and physical space, so as to get to the bottom of mechanisms of perception, thought, and memory and render them physically tangible. Apart from drawings, objects, performances, and expansive installations composed of words and text fragments, he created film-based works. They provided him with an avenue to further pursue his interest in non-linear, fragmentary narrative forms, having already prepared the ground for this approach in his previous text installations.

Mančuška once characterized his artistic work as a contextual exploration of immediate reality, which involves interlacing different fields of art: Literature, film, conceptual art, theater, installation, video, and text. It is this entanglement of different disciplines, that renders the artist's reflective approach to media palpable. The artist saw the relationship of the "self" to others as the fundamental element of political life. In this sense, he conceived of his art as a political enterprise.

Ján Mančuška (born 1972, Bratislava, died 2011, Prague) lived and worked in Prague and Berlin. Solo exhibitions, a.o. at Centre Vox (Montréal, 2017), Kunsthalle Bratislava, City Gallery Prague (2015), Kunstverein Braunschweig (2010), Kunsthalle Basel (2008). Furthermore, he regularly exhibited at his galleries Andrew Kreps, New York, Meyer Riegger, Karlsruhe and Berlin, and Hunt Kastner, Prague. Group exhibitions: a.o. at National Gallery Prague (2023), Ludwig Museum Budapest (2019), Budeskunsthalle Bonn (2018), New Museum, New York (2015), Institut d'Art Contemporain, Villeurbanne (2013), Festival Panorama de Dança, Rio de Janeiro (2010), MOMA, New York (2009), Tel Aviv Museum of Art (2008), ZKM Karlsruhe (2007), Stedelijk Museum, Amsterdam (2004), 2nd Prague Biennale (2005), Berlin Biennale (2006), Atelier Augarten, Österreichische Galerie Belvedere, Vienna (2005), and Manifesta 4 in Frankfurt (2002).
