Alex Becerra Jazz Drawings vol. ii November 10th - December 22 2023

Galerie Timonier is pleased to present Jazz Drawings vol.ii: Alex Becerra's first solo exhibition in New York City as well as his first exhibition with the gallery.

Most jazz repertories are constituted, in part or entirely, of standards. These are widely understood as musical and/or lyrical guidelines to an ever-expanding songbook - we collectively make our own versions and continually reinvent, restructure, and rethink what it means to perform these compositions. It isn't uncommon to parcel these into smaller, fractured sequences and to shuffle, repurpose and reconsider them. These parcels are thought of as "quotes," and are left for the listener to pick up on - much like a trail of bread crumbs: a sequence of notes that are familiar, a particular tone or attack which are reminiscent of another's body of work, which help the listener adapt to the expansive musical and harmonic vernacular of jazz. Time and dedicated listening are the only guarantee in terms of pattern recognition.

The present body of work should be thought of as an act of collection and collection, in it of itself, might be thought of as "the struggle against dispersion." Becerra proposes an all-star line-up much like the superbands of the 1960's, or a personal orchestra akin to a personal fantasy football team. The selection of musicians ranges from the brightest, best known parts of the pantheon, such as Dolphy, Sanders, or Coleman, to more obscure, yet just as canonical, figures like Abdullah, Hannah, or Hino. Much like musical quotation, Becerra borrows references for album covers, interview photos, or liner note illustrations to name but a few. These references are then mashed, overlayed, distorted and entirely reappropriated to create these reimagined depictions of the musicians. There is a kind of compulsion to them, the way a younger person might feel compelled to relisten, reread or rewatch the object of their interest over and over again. That same inertia pushes Becerra to keep on revisiting these portraits, ever reaching for the attainment of the impossible jazz collection. Beyond the obsessiveness there is reverence - one might notice the homogeneity of scale: there are no hierarchies. All who are present figure in Becerra's expansive record collection, these works are the artist's version of an ode.


When asked about his introduction to Jazz, Becerra cites his undergraduate years at Otis, his grappling to understand the esoterics of a harmonic vocabulary foreign to all but those who dedicate time and patience to them. Perhaps, even, is there a parallel between the sonic and formal disciplines: learning to develop an ear as well as an eye and a hand.


These drawings, spanning 2019 to 2023, are an embodiment of exercise and exploration, not only in a formal way but with equal consideration for typography and color theory. They showcase both works that are made of ballpoint pen as well as ballpoint pen with marker in an exercise of "illustrative mark making," as Becerra refers to it. The way improvisation might be considered to be spontaneous composition, Becerra articulates all of this by cross hatching immediately to paper without the crutch of prior pencil tracing to render these highly counterpointed and polyphonic drawings.
























