

Christopher Peckham Jupiter Drive 9/14/2023 - 10/22/2023

The relief cuts on the back of a door jamb provide stress relief to the wood from 'cupping' a kind of warping particular to the cylindrical nature of trees where the bark side of a quarter-sawn board shrinks more than the heart, or inner, side causing the edges of the board to raise away from the center of the surface. Routed into each edge of a jamb is a two degree bevel encouraging the casing of a door to fit flush against the wall in which the door is installed. These measures are applied to ensure the long term integrity of the mechanical transition between open and closed positions. Jupiter Drive is a feeling in high orbit, inspired by the astrological, expanding energies and personal growth of our solar system's largest planet and god. Physically, it is waiting in a long long line at the pharmacy while upbeat pop songs jam through an intercom, interrupted constantly by conglomeratesque ads, notably to sell scent diffusers mimicking the smell of the season. The litany of affirmations do indeed resonatewhether a mood is encountered or devised it remains important to allow good things to happen.
