Charlie Prodger *The Offering Formula* December 1 – February 25, 2024 Galerie

Charlie Prodger (b.1974) is a Scottish artist working with moving image, photography, sculpture and drawing. She won the 2018 Turner Prize and represented Scotland at the 2019 Venice Biennale. She is currently a 2023–24 Fellow at the Radcliffe Institute for Advanced Study, Harvard University.

Prodger's work orbits histories - from the weight of deep geological time to more contingent forms of narrative such as anecdote and oral history. Through the prism of queer subjectivity, her work explores intertwined relations between the body, landscape, language and technology. *The Offering Formula* brings together drawings, photographs and a trilogy of films, made between 2010 and 2023.

Rooms 1 and 2: Drawings and photographs

The first two rooms consist of photographs and a new series of drawings. Prodger is fascinated by processes of conservation and preservation, whereby materials and time, permanence and entropy, are held in perpetual balance and data migrates from one format to another ad finitum, under the constant threat of obsolescence. Three still life drawings depict mises-en-abyme of layered LPs and CDs Prodger has owned since her childhood in the 1980s. She has meticulously drawn in the scratches, stains and patina of age, like a kind of reverse conservation. A fourth drawing shows a collection of the artist's hard drives, all named after female figures of influence and admiration to her. This box, holding the entirety of Prodger's archive from the last two decades, is a form of self-portraiture through data.

Prodger's 2019 photographic series *Palace Prints* depicts pages the artist extracted from a book showing Assyrian palace reliefs of lion hunts, made around 640 BC, which she then collaged on a gridded cutting mat. In palace reliefs of this period, the distinction between foreground and background appears flattened, counter to the illusionary depth of linear perspective. These spatial systems echo Prodger's ongoing preoccupation with perspective in relation to bodies and landscape. Rosalind Krauss's seminal 1979 essay *The Grid* is a frequent touchstone for Prodger, in which the grid is investigated as both a system of coordinates for containing things and a vast infinity extending beyond the edges of the frame.

Prodger's fern pieces (2015–16) present found taxonomical images of fern species that have remained unchanged since prehistory and are renowned for their ability to survive in marginal habitats. They are overlaid with geometrically perforated Plexiglass, replicating the patterns of ventilation grills on Prodger's industrial video monitors.

Sophie With Sheets, 2010, is a series of four analogue photographs made while Prodger was studying at Calarts from 2009–10. The Xerox sheets – a teaching aid left behind from an animation drawing class – depict a fist rotating in sequential units; their function is to teach students of cell animation how to draw anatomical movement frame by frame. This framing of bodily gesture through a queer lens is an early example of Prodger rubbing the formal parameters of time and technology up against coded queerness, female masculinity and the intimate contingency of materials.

Room 3: Film trilogy

In the third room, Prodger exhibits together for the first time her renowned trilogy *Stoneymollan Trail* (2015), *BRIDGIT* (2016), and *SaF05* (2019). This autobiographical cycle traces the accumulation of affinities, desires and losses that form a self as it moves forward in time.

Stoneymollan Trail (2015) commissioned for the 2014 Margaret Tait Award, begins with a sequence composed from Prodger's archive of deteriorating DV tapes filmed between 1999 and 2013. Named after an ancient "coffin road" on the west coast of Scotland, the work traces a history of recent video formats intertwined with Prodger's personal history. For her voiceovers, Prodger invited friends to read her personal diaristic content – as an extended embodiment of the self. *Stoneymollan Trail* includes quotes from the memoir of science fiction writer Samuel Delaney and includes an extract from an essay by post-minimalist artist Nancy Holt, exploring the contingent limits between self and other via intimacy and labour. Prodger uses citation as a form of dedication, incorporating oral histories, personal letters, her own writing and the words of others. She seeks to counter linear history and its imperative of progress by producing a matrix of queer relations.

BRIDGIT (2016), for which Prodger won the 2018 Turner Prize, takes its title from the eponymous Neolithic deity, whose name has numerous iterations depending on life stage, locality and point in history. Exploring the shifting temporal interrelations of name, body, and landscape, *BRIDGIT* focuses on female attachments—a process of identification that includes friends, shape-shifting deities and other figures of influence. *BRIDGIT* was shot entirely on Prodger's phone, which she approaches as a sculptural device; a prosthesis or extension of the nervous system—intimately connected to the movements of the body, to global social interaction and work.

SaF05 (2019), with which Prodger represented Scotland at the 2019 Venice Biennale, draws on archival, scientific and diaristic sources and combines footage from a number of geographical locations (the Scottish Highlands, the Great Basin Desert, the Okavango Delta and the Ionian Islands). *SaF05* is named after a maned lioness that figures in the work as a cipher for queer attachment and desire. This animal was the last of several maned lionesses documented in the Okavango Delta, known to Prodger only through a database of behaviours and camera-trap footage logged by conservationists. Here, she uses film industry cameras, a smartphone, a camera-trap and a flying drone, each employed for their inherent material properties. The hum of the drone is taken up as a sonic motif that mutates throughout the soundtrack via a bagpipe, a cicada mating call, a saxophone and a battery alarm – syncopated equivalences between animal and human,

instrument and machine. Concurrently, Prodger's voiceover traces a chronology of intimate gestures and interpersonal connections from pubescence to the present, inscribed with wider political structures of sovereignty, land use and territory. *SaF05* is a meditation on relations that expand and diffuse conceptions of intimacy, sexuality, and kinship.

For the book, the artist has created a series of image pairings of production photos and video stills from the final part of the trilogy, *SaF05*.
