

Joshua Abelow & Katya Kirilloff *Villains* March 28 – May 8, 2024

We have the American Corporation, Monsanto\* to thank for PCBs, Polystyrene, Agent Orange, and Synthetic Bovine Growth Hormone. In 1974, Monsanto introduced the product RoundUp® Herbicide to the market. Roundup® AKA Glyphosate, is currently banned in or will soon be banned in at least ten countries including Mexico, Germany, Saudi Arabia, and Vietnam. And at least 15 others have restricted its use. In a recent study, it was determined to be found in 80% of American bodies. It is a known endocrine disruptor. Research now links glyphosate to cancer, reproductive problems, neurological diseases, birth defects, complications with fertility and pregnancy. Research is being done to determine how exposure increases risks of infant mortality and interferes with child development. RoundUp® resistant seeds are widely used in farming corn, wheat, and soy. For the most part we the consumer are kept in the dark, our relationship is with Monsanto's friendly helpful marketing tactics.
