Josefine Reisch Pseudo

For this exhibition, JOSEFINE REISCH has installed a museum storage structure to present new paintings centered around the idea of pretense—things that aren't what they are purported to be. Womanliness, ostentation and opportunism in these works tell stories of sham: decorative fabrics depicting costumes and jeweled headpieces from the history of theater and film (Liz Taylor and Sarah Bernhardt among other characters), and politics (former German war minister, now EU president Ursula von der Leyen). Female representation becomes archetypal for assumption.

A golden canvas delves into pretense and art history, evoking what lies around and behind "The Death of Marat" by French artist Jacques-Louis David. The 19th century painting and instance of European official heritage, housed in the Royal Museums in Brussels near the gallery, hides the female murderer of Marat. The luxurious picture frame features what surrounds this historic picture but also hints at the artist's reputation: David himself is an example of an artist whose repeated changes of political opinions and sides evoke questions on the integrity of his work and those that have purportedly celebrated it throughout the centuries.

JOSEFINE REISCH lives and works in Berlin. She graduated from Kunstakademie Düsseldorf in 2013 and completed her MFA Fine Arts from Goldsmith University of London in 2017. She is currently a participant of BPA //Berlin Program for Artists.
