Take, Retake and Remake (Back the Night) Mar García Albert

"Tonight we are going to walk together, all of us, to take back the night [...]." (*Take Back The Night*)

La Salle de bains is delighted to present Take, Retake and Remake (Back the Night), a solo exhibition by the Parisbased artist Mar García Albert. In her practice, she develops a critical perspective on painting by examining its production, presentation and distribution against the background of its historical inscriptions. In her paintings, she reflects with criticism on the medium and its context, focusing on what constitutes a picture and how it is created.

For her solo exhibition at La Salle de bains, Mar García Albert has developed a concept that refers to the feminist protest «Take Back The Night », one of the oldest worldwide movements, which started in the US in 1973. A part of the series of paintings based on the representations of feminist protestors, portraits that the artist uses to draw attention to different facets of darkness — and thus to other invisible fields of society. At the same time, it is only at night that women can find the time to organize themselves.

The artist herself has examined her practice in terms of time-economic factors therefore painting on canvases wrapped in plastic — actually saving time between the studio and the supermarket, care work and artistic practice It is a pinch of humor that always resonates in Mar García Albert's work.

In this sense the plastic film creates a barrier between the painting and the canvas, thus cancelling — both physically and symbolically — the romantic notion of materially inscribing the traces of artistic subjectivity directly onto the canvas. The canvas is never painted. It cannot even be painted over while remaining forever available to be painted for the first time. Confronting with the copy, Mar García Albert also questions the original, authorship, signature and male dominance in the arts field. She is in fact showing two exhibitions at La Salle de bains : a reprise — a remake — of the exhibition she showed at New Jörg in Vienna this spring, and the exhibition itself.

Biography


Mar García Albert (*1980) lives and works in Paris. She holds an MA from the Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne. Her work was presented in solo and group exhibitions, notably at New Jörg Kunstverein, Vienna (2024), Villa Belleville, Paris, Glassbox, Paris, Kunstverein Bielefeld (all in 2023), DOC, Paris (2021), Centre Pompidou, Paris, Centre del Carmen CCCCV, Valencia (both 2020), FRAC Champagne- Ardenne, Reims, Kunstverein am Rosa-Luxemburg-Platz, Berlin (both in 2019), Fondation Entreprise Ricard, Paris (2018), and Sala Gran, La Capella, Barcelona (2015).
