He is an alumnus of the Whitney Independent Study Program and is a part-time lecturer at the New School and the University of Pennsylvania. Recent solo and two-person exhibitions include: Galerie Thomas Schulte, Berlin (2023); Galerie Noah Klink, Berlin (2023); Art Lot, Brooklyn (2023); Theta, New York (2021). Emilio Martínez Poppe (b. 1993, Baltimore, MD) is an artist and educator based in New York.
