

When I can't get to sleep, I dismantle my world
Audrey Gair & Allan Rand

Galerie Eli Kerr is pleased to host an exhibition of 12 paintings by Audrey Gair and Allan Rand.

Audrey Gair's practice questions the painter's subjective approach to representation, iteration, and material-play. In her work Gair uses repeated imagery and subjects, such as stacks of books, pumpkins and couches to imagine new frontiers in the language of abstract painting. Gair conceives of each work on its own, devising hypothetical prompts for the paintings before they are made. Each painting is an experiment, informed equally by craft adjacent projects and process-based aesthetics, stressing the act of the medium and prioritizing the moves, texture, and application of paint. The choices made in each painting inform the next ones, suggesting an augmentation of her initial solution. The paintings become containers for an expansive world to be imagined. Each painting is a demarcation of Gair's aesthetic freedom, detached from the weight of illustration and technique.

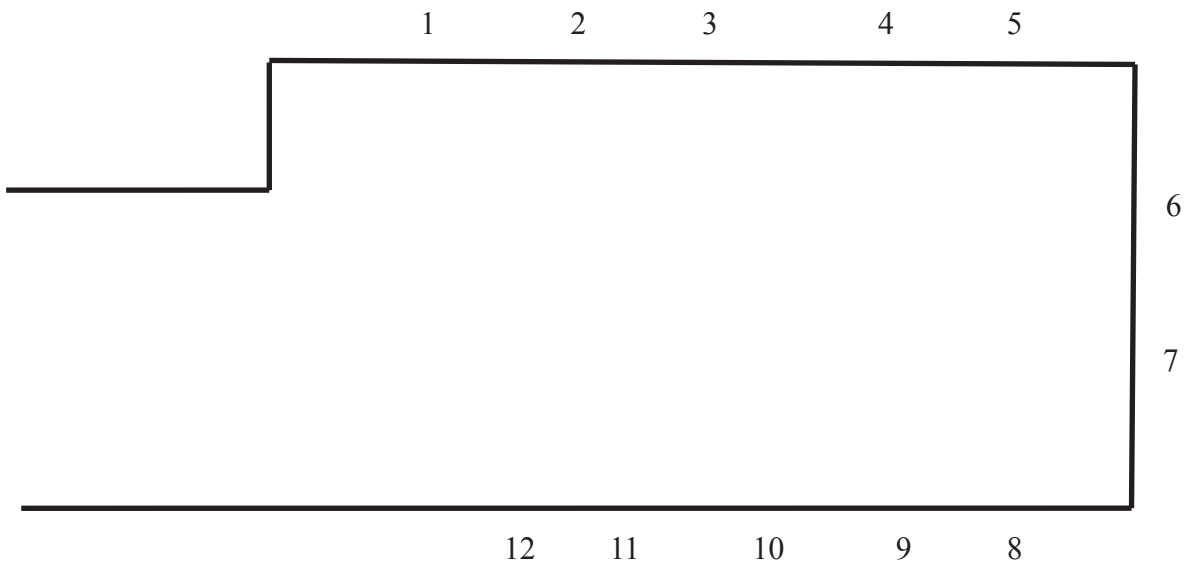
Audrey Gair (b.1992, Miami) lives and works in New York where she is represented by King's Leap. She holds a BFA from the Maryland Institute College of Art, and has had solo exhibitions at Kings Leap (New York), South Parade (London), and Bad Water (Knoxville). Group presentations including Gair's work have taken place at Depa Archive (Ghent), Room 3557 (Los Angeles) and Galerie Crèvecoeur (Paris), amongst others.

Allan Rand (b. 1983, Denmark) is a visual artist based in Düsseldorf, currently residing on the Australian coast with a Kunststiftung NRW stipend. He holds an MFA from the Kunstakademie Düsseldorf and has also studied at the Royal College of Art in London. Rand has received grants from the Danish Arts Foundation, Stiftung Kunstfonds, the Ministry of Culture of North Rhine-Westphalia, and the Hielmstjerne-Rosencroneske Foundation. His work has been exhibited in Germany, Britain, France, Greece, Portugal, Denmark, Australia, and the United States, including at Marres House for Contemporary Culture (Maastricht), Kunstmuseum Solingen, Galerie Nagel Draxler (Cologne), Jacobigarten of Künstlerverein Malkasten (Düsseldorf), and POUH (Paris).
