Do you guys have a dashcam yet? You've gotta get a dashcam. I just got one a couple months ago, they're the best...as long as you're a good driver. You've never gotta worry that someone's gonna hit you. The one I got is just incredible, I got the model that faces the front and the back. The front video is in 4k, 155 degree camera angle, the back video is 1080 P.

Now I have been seeing dash cam videos online for years. I remember it was always dashcams in places, ya know, with not very good road rules, not much police enforcement, with crazy drivers. Bad roads too, roads that have deep potholes. I think they're big in Russia.

So, you need a dashcam for the insurance company. Because there's a lot of insurance fraud. *A lot* of insurance fraud. I'll tell you about how I realized I needed a dashcam. I was scrolling through my phone watching videos, and I saw a dashcam video of a woman driving on Bay Parkway, which is not too far from where I live. She was talking to her husband on speakerphone, and then a silver Volkswagon golf comes over in front of this lady, really fast, cuts her off, and then you just see brake lights! They slam on their brakes. And, luckily, she was paying attention, she was hands free on the phone, and she was able to stop in time. It was unbelievable, what happened next. So, these people in front of her...they put their car in reverse, and backed into her!! She screamed, she didn't know what the hell was happening. Her husband was like "what's wrong, what happened??"

Then like four people got out of the car, and they started milling around, rubbing their lower backs, rubbing their heads like they are injured, they started taking photos of her license plate. There was another car too.. A red car. Hmm, what happened with the red car?... I can't remember. But then they saw that she had a dash cam, and suddenly they changed. They saw that their faces were on camera, they hopped back in the car, and they drove off. Now again this was just over on bay parkway in brooklyn, not too far from me, so it really hit home.

And it made national news, it got 70 million views on tik tok—it was an insurance fraud attempt! Not just for the car repair but for injury insurance too. And the woman said in an interview, "I'm so glad I had a dash cam."

And I wish, I wish that I had started selling dash cams before this,, drop shipping on an amazon storefront, or something, because i know that their sales went through the roof after this video came out. I bought one! I bought one so, I know there's a lot of other responsible people buying one too. There are accessories, there are subscription services. So many opportunities with these dashcams. If I had been laid off just a little earlier than I was, I could have started shipping dashcams before this video came out. I'm sure I would have started too, if I knew how to do it.

Because insurance fraud is illegal. Insurance fraud is illegal. And if we let insurance fraud happen, it makes it more expensive for everybody else. Our country falls apart when people start doing things like insurance fraud. Ya know, there are rules in this country, you gotta trust it, you gotta follow the rules. And, you know, it's only getting worse in the future... Insurance fraud is getting worse, I think, along with a lot of things. You've really gotta protect yourself. Insurance, prenups, contracts. You can't be going through life thinking that you're going to be lucky, because you won't be. Ya know, bad things can happen to good responsible people.

So again, I got one of these dash cams with two cameras. you mount one on the dashboard, uhh, and there's a second camera, you mount it on the back above your license plate. So it's got a monitor on it about the size of an iphone...there's a split screen and so you see what's in back of you and what's in front of you at the same time. You need to see what's going on behind you so if you get rear ended, you've got that on video too.

I love watching the footage. I've gotta tell you something..haha..I had to start facing the screen away from me because I would just get lost in it. First week that I got it I zoned out, and my car kind of tends to drift to the right, and I hit the rumble strip... on the side of the highway. Haha. Ok, let's try to keep the car on the road.

But you see the cars sort of move towards you on the top screen and then disappear for a second. So they're in the blind spot of the camera. And then they reappear and fade away after you pass them. It's like a time warp. It's hard to look away, I almost drove off the road looking at the screen. It's not the first time I've driven off the road... wish it was.

Yes, so when you're in your car on the dashcam... You're kind of in between where you're going and where you were. Watching the future and the past at the same time. People always say "the present moment, the present moment." "Be in the here and now." As if it's stable, but it's not true. It's not true. The here and now is so thin it's like the edge of a knife... you're standing on it, zooming forward.

Ok so It's just moving at the exact speed that the future is coming towards you and the past is leaving you. Right? It's moving at a speed, what speed is it, the speed of time? The speed of light? ...the speed of time? 60 seconds in a minute?

On the dash cam it's clear, its ya know, whatever speed you are going. 55 mph on the highway... 15 mph in traffic, haha. You can see it clear as day.

Ah ha and by the way, in the dash cam, the past doesn't look so negative, doesn't look so bad. It just looks normal, same with the future. So if that doesn't make you go buy one.

Man I gotta get into selling these. Time just passes by so fast, I feel like I blinked and 10 years passed.
