BIOGRAPHIES

<u>Wanwen Zhang</u> (b.1994, Emeishan) lives and works between Frankfurt am Main, Germany and her hometown. Her practice involves a multitude of spatial encounters and circumstances, through nuanced gestures expressed in painting, drawing, calligraphy, animation, comic book, film and sound.

<u>Wei Yang</u> (b. 1994, Liuzhou) is an artist living and working between Liuzhou and Frankfurt am Main. Yang explores human conditions as a fluid and diasporic geography. By layering senses of intimacy and belonging, he creates hybrid images drawn from folklore, myth, marginalized histories, and personal landscapes.
