[Unique digital video authored to DVD and Fuji Crystal Archival color still photographs from video. Aerial views from a seaplane trip over Manhattan Island. Moving video and still frame prints record the flight path beginning at the George Washington Bridge and gliding down the West Side Highway to the Crystal Palaces of Lower Manhattan and the watery Harbor beyond. A noticeable ripple-like effect of pixel breakup characterizes the video. This effect was caused by re-recording on rewind, in which pronounced pixilation is further enhanced by original use of camera's digital zoom, providing lower resolution with any additional anomaly (rewind or slow motion), adding artifacts. First shown in solo show at American Fine Arts/Pat Hearn Gallery in 2003.]

Blue Angels 1998 21 & 36 minutes Two channel video, color, sound

[Two cameras follow the aerial performance of the Blue Angels in the skies above San Francisco. Originals shot in Hi8 and digital video authored to DVD.]

Olympiad 1997 36 minute loop Video, black and white, silent

[Original shot in Hi8 color, remastered to Betacam SP, b&w, silent and authored to DVD. Video record of a walk through Olympic Stadium in Berlin in June 1997 displays the sporadic signal disturbances, tracking problems, stoppages, burnouts and other artifacts of a corrupted or damaged videotape processed through a time base corrector. Paradoxically this graphic degradation enhances even as it disturbs the classical aspirations of the haunted site. First shown at Rupert Goldsworthy, NY, in 1998, then in the 2000 Whitney Biennial, and most recently in *Being There—I Like to Watch TV*, at Participant Inc, NY, in 2006.]
