Kathy Temin has created Three Indoor Monuments specifically around the three gallery spaces at ACCA. The three rooms are considered in relation to the different ideas of the form of an indoor monument, and relate to art history, Jewish history and to notions of ritual and the home.

The exhibition contains references to the work of such key historical artists as Frank Stella and Eve Hesse.

Traditional monuments are usually conceived in durable materials to ensure their permanency. In contrast, Temin uses materials such as synthetic fur, felt and video to explore other possibilities in relation to the physical dimensions of the spaces and the temporary duration of the exhibition.
