

Burnt house. A little later. is a project facilitated by Sarah Hopkinson, Kate Newby et al. *Burnt house. A little later.* takes place in the timeframe usually allocated to an exhibition, but turns its attention to the auxiliaries of the exhibition format, creating a publication, a downstairs courtyard, and a program of events that take place in the 454 K Rd space throughout the month.

In keeping with Gambia Castle's interest in the occasional, economical, improvised and hard-to-pin-down, *Burnt house. A little later.* is a short-lived, quick-footed project guided by an interest in immaterial outcomes and time spent. Without actually having any work at its centre, *Burnt house. A little later.* looks to ideas or things that might be interesting to do, sit in, make and talk about and people that might be interesting to hear from. *Burnt house. A little later.* remembers the aspirations of work that realizes itself in actions and conversations, offering speculation on how a contemporary project can be both event-oriented (and largely product-less) and endure (historically) through memory and documentation.

For 4 consecutive Fridays and Saturdays in May (and early June) you are invited to participate in a program of events (details overleaf) from which minutes, notes and documentation will be generated and stored in a temporary archive chamber in the back room. For *Burnt house. A little later.* Gambia Castle becomes non-gallery and non-school, transformed by et al. into a pedagogical site wherein the problems of the learning institution are inscribed in the environment.

Over the 4 weeks Newby and Hopkinson will produce a short-run of hand-made publications collectively titled "A roof to discuss under". These books will be made available from Gambia Castle, as they happen.

Newby's downstairs courtyard, situated at the rear of Gambia Castle and s/f, will be visitable and usable for the duration of the exhibition, entrance via s/f during s/f opening hours [Friday + Saturday 12-6pm].
